Subject: PLAYGROUND REPLACEMENT – NORTH BEACH

Fiscal Impact: This project is budgeted at \$300,000 and is included in the FY 2022-23 budget. The

proposals considered in this report vary in cost but can be reduced to meet the maximum allocated budget. Additional details related to this are included in the

Discussion section of the report.

Summary: Staff recommends that the Commission select a playground design for the scheduled

playground replacement at North Beach and provide a recommendation to the City

Council for approval.

Background: The City has recently begun the initiation of the North Beach Placemaking Plan to

revitalize the historic district of North Beach, encourage new visitors, and perpetuate positive resident engagement within the area. A critical component of this project is the replacement of the existing playground equipment on the beach proper of North Beach. This playground area once housed swing sets and a slide, but has been

reduced over time due to sand loss.

In Fall 2023, staff conducted an online public survey to gain feedback on the typical uses of the existing North Beach playground and what features users desired to see in the future. Survey results are included in Attachment 1.

Following the closure of the survey, staff analyzed the date provided and subsequently released a Request for Proposals to all interested playground manufacturers and design groups. The City received three qualified proposals.

Discussion:

The online survey yielded 209 responses and provided a baseline for design considerations. Based on data from this survey and input from professional staff, the following items should be considered in the overall design of the playground:

- Shade over the playground
- Slide(s)
- Swing(s)
- Ramp/Platform is preferred
- Ocean/beach or sea-themed
- Climbing features

Out of the designs submitted, staff is recommending the Commission consider the following options from the proposals received (Attachment 2). The options are highlighted below with cost estimates and key features listed.

Structure 1: Pacific Play Option 1 – Pirate Theme (\$293,948)

- Shade structure over the playground
- Swing set (2 seats and 1 play share seat)
- Sand digger/excavator
- Pirate ship play structure
- Sensory play panel

Structure 2: Pacific Play Option 2 – Boat Theme (\$339,275)

- Boat play structure
- Interactive standalone speed boat
- Shade structure over the playground
- Swing set (2 seats)
- Whale climbing feature
- The total can be reduced to \$324,696 by removing the seesaw and sensory play panel; additional reduction to the cost can be accomplished by removing the whale climber (\$24,250) or the speed boat (\$15,414)

Structure 3: Western State Builders – Beach Shack (\$320,984)

- Beach shack playground with
- Surfboard climbing ramp to playground
- Surf van/bus climber
- Standalone leaf seat with shade
- The total cost can be reduced to under \$300,000 by removing the drum feature, gas pump station, and store panel/leaning rail.

Structure 4: Zoom Recreation Option 1 – Beach Swings & Structure (\$186,501)

- Beach theme play structure with shade
- Swing set with shade (2 seats)

Structure 5: Zoom Recreation Option 2 – Jeep & Structure (\$265,125)

- Beach theme play structure with shade
- Lifeguard jeep and boat with shade

Action:

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT the Beaches, Parks, and Recreation Commission select a playground design for North Beach and recommend the City Council approve the installation of the proposed playground design.




