#### REGULAR MEETING - MARCH 18, 1987

A Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of San Clemente, conducted in the Council Chambers, Civic Center Building, 100 Avenida Presidio, was called to order by Mayor Veale at 7:00 p.m.

#### INVOCATION

Pastor Brian Burnette, of Calvary Chapel, gave the invocation.

## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Veale led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 1. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

- A. Iris Swanson, member of the Board of Trustees of Saddleback College, reviewed the operations and achievements of Saddleback Community College; introduced Constance Carroll, President; Dr. Ann McFarlin, Acting Vice Chancellor; and Richard Sneed, Chancellor of the College.
- B. Mayor Veale presented a proclamation to Margaret Hoffman and Ann Goad, of the American Association of University Women, declaring the month of March, 1987 as "Women's History Month." Ms. Hoffman presented a film demonstrating the advancement of women.
- 2. MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER

RICE, CARRIED 4-0 (COUNCILMEMBER LORCH ABSENT) to waive reading in full of all Resolutions and Ordinances.

#### 3. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. <u>Tentative Tract Map No. 12883, Site Plan Review 86-07, Remington Properties</u>

Public Hearing to consider a request for a 213 lot subdivision creating 207 residential lots and six common lots within Planning Area 18 of the Rancho San Clemente Specific Plan.

Gil Martinez, of Florian Martinez Associates, reviewed the background of the application; narrated a slide presentation ilustrating the project; felt the project complies with the Hillside Grading Ordinance.

Mayor Veale opened the Public Hearing.

There being no one desiring to speak to this issue, the Public Hearing was closed.

Mr. Martinez answered Council inquiries relating to the proposed elevations, topography of the property, size of the tot lots and side yards, and CC&R restrictions as they relate to recreational vehicle parking.

During the course of discussion, Councilmembers raised concerns as follows:

- Monotonous repetition of the architectural design.
- 2) Lack of daylighting or break in contour along edge of slope between "C" Street and Calle Pastadero.
- 3) Interruption of the paseo on the westerly side of "A" and "E" Streets at southerly end of the development.
- 4) Proposed 7' setback of homes.
- 5) Project layout as it relates to the intent of the Hillside Grading Ordinance.

Senior Planner Goldin responded to Council inquiries as follows:

1) With respect to Council concern that there is no break in contour along the lower row of homes, Mr. Goldin advised that the Planning Commission and Community Design Commission addressed this issue and felt it was not visible from designated view points within the City; also felt that a view corridor from the inside of the project looking outside was not essential due to the variations in elevations.

- 2) Relative to Council concern pertaining to the repetition of design, Mr. Goldin advised that the impact would be alleviated because of the variation in setbacks and curvilinear streets.
- Relating to Council concern with the proposed break in the paseo, Mr. Goldin indicated that the Planning Commission and Community Design Commission indicated a preference for the paseo in its present location; stated it would not be feasible from an engineering perspective to offset the paseo through the slope areas due to the steep grade of the slope.

Police Chief McDaniel responded to Council inquiry, stating the Police Department would not object to the placement of pathways through the greenbelts; stated he is concerned with the proposal for 7' driveways inasmuch as cars parked on the driveways would encroach onto the sidewalk.

Dave Christian, Project Manager for Rancho San Clemente, stated there are sidewalks on one side of Calle Pastadero and Calle Montana; stated that school busses do not drive on private streets and hence will stop at development entrances at Calle Pastadero and Calle Montana; agreed to coordinate with the School District to resolve concerns relative to bus stop locations.

Fire Chief Dailey advised the Fire Department is satisfied with the project from a fire safety aspect.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER RICE, CARRIED 5-0, to direct the developer to redesign the northwesterly corner of "E" and "F" Streets near the intersection to allow the continuation of the paseo along the entire length of "E" Street.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER RICE, CARRIED 5-0, to direct the developer to work with staff to devise an architectural method to provide daylighting/view corridors for the houses between Calle Pastadero and "F" Street in at least two different places and where there will be fencing as opposed to block wall.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LORCH, CARRIED 5-0, to direct the developer to work with staff to provide access points and pathways through the greenbelt areas, if feasible.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LIMBERG, FAILED 2-3 (COUNCILMEMBERS RICE, LORCH, AND MAYOR VEALE VOTING NOE) to approve Tentative Tract Map No. 12883 and Site Plan Review 86-07, subject to the conditions and findings recommended by the Planning Commission, with the addition of conditions relating to Council action relative to continuation of the paseo, provision of view corridors within houses that border Calle Pastadero, and provision of access points and pathways through the greenbelt areas.

## N. Perimeter Barrier for Golf Course

The following individuals spoke in opposition to the proposed guard rail, citing concerns for graffiti, safety, aesthetics, maintenance and maintaining open space:

Charlene Bailey, 405 Avenida Ortega Clifford Gates, 119 Santa Inez Karoline Koester, 401 Via Pajaro.

Scott Sabins, 330 Avenida Santa Margarita, presented a petition, signed by 90 residents, opposing the barrier based on concerns relating to aesthetics and safety.

Golf Course Manager Linden responded to Council query, stating the most significant problem associated with the golf course concerns the existence of unauthorized vehicles; summarized damage caused by the six incidents that occurred in the last three months.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LIMBERG, CARRIED 5-0, to reject the request to install the proposed barrier around the golf course.

#### Q. Traffic Control Device Inventory

Councilmember Lorch expressed concern with staff's proposal to retain a consultant in connection with the Traffic Control Device Inventory Program.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LORCH, CARRIED 5-0, to authorize staff to apply for a \$48,000 grant from the Office of Traffic Safety to establish a Traffic Control Device Inventory Program.

### A. Site Plan Review 86-09 - Lincoln Properties

Report from the Community Development Director concerning a request for a 368 unit apartment complex within Planning Area 22.

Barbara Johnson, of Lincoln Properties, provided an overview of the proposal.

Scott Adams, representing Lincoln Properties, reviewed the site plan; narrated a slide presentation demonstrating the proposed layout, architecture and landscaping for the project; answered Council inquiries relating to the size of the tot lot, barbeque areas, provision of affordable housing, and pedestrian access between the upper and lower pads.

Council discussion ensued relative to 1) the fact that only one pedestrian linkage is proposed between the upper and lower pads and the proximity of the stairway to the recreation area, 2) architecture of the carports, 3) proposed tar and stone roof treatment of the carports, 4) concern for centralization of too many affordable units in one planning area, 5) feasibility of integrating the drainage areas with walkways, and 6)

preference for meandering walkways.

Steve Kingston, 4011 Calle Abril, spoke in support of the proposal, citing his concurrence with the parking ratio and existence of carports as opposed to garages.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER LIMBERG, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER RICE, CARRIED 5-0, to adopt Resolution No. 87-17 entitled, A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING SITE PLAN REVIEW NO. 86-09 AND PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTION FROM FURTHER ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 15182 OF CEQA, with the proviso that an additional condition be added to require that a second pedestrian linkage be provided between the upper and lower pads in a manner acceptable to staff.

#### B. Skateboard Ordinance

Report from the Police Chief concerning adoption of an ordinance describing regulations, restrictions and guidelines for skateboard riders.

Robert Bonanno, member of the San Clemente High School Student Council and Chairman of the Skateboard Ordinance Committee, outlined the Committee's process to formulate the Ordinance; recommended approval of the Ordinance and investigation into the feasibility of a skateboard park.

Police Chief McDaniel outlined the enforcement penalties associated with the Ordinance.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER RICE, CARRIED 5-0, to introduce Ordinance No. 938, entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE ADDING CHAPTER 14A TO THE SAN CLEMENTE CITY CODE REGULATING THE USE AND OPERATION OF SKATEBOARDS WITHIN THE CITY.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MECHAM, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER LIMBERG, CARRIED 5-0, to instruct the Parks and Recreation Commission to research the feasibility of the City to provide a skateboard park.

# C. <u>Final Map Approval - Tract 12284 - Epac Development,</u> <u>Rancho San Clemente</u>

Report from the Community Development Director concerning approval of the final map of Tract 12284 (Epac Development) in Phase II of Rancho San Clemente.
