
Dear Council Members,

I agree with John's comments to improve safety along ECR. We hope City Council supports Staff's recommendation to add a turn lane and improve cross traffic visibility.

The line of sight at Santiago is always impacted by palm trees, and often completely blocked by cars parked along ECR (as shown in John's photos), this does not allow vehicles enough time to react and brake in time. I refer to the photo below as an example of an accident in front of Biggies.

Additionally, vehicles traveling southbound on ECR often speed especially if they are anticipating getting on the freeway.
