One picture is of a strike at the Alphabeta in 1973 as a result of the Meat Boycott was a week-long National Boycott in the United States to protest the rapidly increasing meat prices that took place from April 1 to April 8, 1973. The picture was from a fb page.

The signal light has been there since the time when President Nixon was in office.

The bollards at El Camino Real are to prevent collisions in the area. There may be more traffic because there is more sand at T-street versus the Pier.
