Ayer and the Supt. of Public Works had been authorized to make a survey of the San Matew Creek to determine the most desirable location for a well site, but no report had been made whether it had been done or not. This thing should be set up for post war requirements. Councilman Preston would go into this matter with the City Engineer.

City Engineer, William A. Ayer stated that all lots around the Plaza had been zoned for business, which evidentally was a mistake on our part, as according to Deed restrictions these are shown as residential. He said if you wanted a F. H. A. Loan on these lots you could not get it as it was impossible to obtain a loan for business property. Our zonind instructions did not follow the deed restrictions. The F. H. A. will make loans on multiple dwellings but not on business property. Mayor Strang said the matter would be considered at the next meeting of the City Council.

The City Engineer also stated that every Title issued by the Orange County Title Company to lots or land in the San Juan Capistrano Creek District were clouded by the Water Suit which the City had some years ago and wanted to know if some way could be devised so that cloud could be lifted. No action was taken on this.
