Bennett, Superintendent of Public Works, reported that he had visited March Field, Riverside County, and inspected the trucks the Army had made available REQUISITION TO E for sale to municipalities etc and found the majority of them in excellent condition. Now that civilian trucks are being replaced by army trucks it might be well to pick up one to replace our old water truck and we can dispose of the latter at a better price now than later on. We have 20 days in which to pick out a truck. He had picked out a 1942 Chevrolet No. 442-17 on the list as suitable. It was a 1942 ton 1948 Chevrolet Pick-Up.
