SUGGESTED PLACING
OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS
AT INTERSECTION OF
DEL MAR AVENUE AND
HIGHWAY 101.

Floyd E. Cowger, Chief of Police, reported on the
Dinner given yesterday to Captain H. C. Meehan, of the
California Highway Patrol, E. W. Fehserseld; Murray Emerson,
Automobile Club of Southern California; P.E. Downey, Orange
County Road Department and A. A. Beard, Orange County Road
Engineer, when the question of "Stop" Signals were gone into.
After dinner the party visited the main inter-
section of town and watched traffic.

We were very fortunate in having several people trying to cross the highway right there at the time we were watching and the cars would not stop for pedestrians any more than they do any other time, and that is very seldom. We all agreed the best device would be an automatic device and of course they could not give us that, but informed us we would have to go higher up in the State Department, or motor vehicle department. However, all agreed they would recommend the erection of an automatic sign at the intersection by the State. They said the State would conduct an investigation and if they find the hazard is great enough they would allow us to erect signals there.

After further discussion, it was recommended that the City Clerk write to Mr. S. V. Cortelyou, District Engineer, Division of Highways, District VII, State Building, Los Angeles, requesting him to have an investigation made of the traffic hazard at the intersection of Del Mar Avenue and Highway 101 in San Clemente, with regards to having a signal installed there.
