TAXI-CAB RATES TO BE PUT UP IN CABS-FOR ALL RIDERS TO SEE.

Moved by Councilman Carrick, seconded by Councilman Palmer, that the Clerk advertise for Sealed Bids or Proposals for supplying to City of Gasoline for the year 1944, said bids to be opened Wednesday, February 16th, 1944, at the hour of 8.00 o'clock, p.m.
On roll-call the following was the stated vote, to-wit:AYES : COUNCILMEN: Smith, Sturgis, Carrick, Palmer and Strang, : COUNCILMEN: None, ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None. The Motion was declared carried.

Mayor Strang addressing Mr. H. O. Parks, of the Coast Cab Company, who had been called in to the meeting, said he wanted him to know that quite a few complaints had been received from service men and others of the excessive rates charged by his company, far above what he greed to charge when he first appeared before the Council for a license to conduct his business of taxicab service.

Mr. Parks replying to Mayor Strang stated that some of the men he had employed have charged a little more than his published rates and he had discharged a couple of his employees for this.

Mayor Strang said the rates should be right in the cab so that passengers could see it. He felt the drivers should be watched as they undoubtedly were making a little on the side - fares were getting just a little bit too high.

Replying to a question of the Mayors, Mr. Parks said

he charged seventy five cents to the camp at the city limits. He would have the scale of charges put up in his cabs so that they would be available for all riders to see. All his cars were fully covered by insurance.

RE REQUEST FOR RAISE FOR MERTON

Councilman Sturgis said he had a request for a raise for one of the employees on the Police department. What he W. HACKETT-FIRE & objected to in this particular case however was the fact this POLICE DEPARTMENT. request did not come to him through the proper channel.

Councilman Carrick said the reports indicated that Mr. Hackett does a valuable piece of work not only for the Police epartment but for the Fire epartment and County as a whole, and said he put in a large number of hours on duty and that his work certainly deserved a salary of \$150.00 per month, so he would make that as a Motion. There was no seconder to the Motion.

Chief Cowger said he had worked for the City five years and during that time tried to be fair to everybody. We had one of the best police departments in Southern California. They all worked together as one department. He believed all the boys working for him were with him and they were satisfied with the way things had been going. He had the interest of the City at heart and did not want the City to get the name it had before. His department had the confidence

of the F.B.I. Last week they phoned down herecand asked us to go on a job and the job was taken care of. He knew his department had the respect of all law enforcement agencies in the State and when someone tried to undermine the department he and his officers resented it. Chief Cowger said Hackett is doing a good job but he did think that any reports put out of his office should go through him - not that he objected to these reports going out but they should go through him.

Mayor Strang said at the League meeting the other night one of the members came to him and complimented the San Clemente Police pertment and wished they had the same in their City.

Councilman Palmer stated that in talking to an official from Sacramento who had been looking over the records of what our Police department had been doing he told me that we were to be complimented on the work this department was doing down here.

Councilman Sturgis explained that when anyone came to him regarding city business he told them to go before the Council or

get in touch with the commissioner of that department. He did not

know the wage request was coming up.

At this juncture Mr. Hackett informed the Council he was turning in his badge on the 15th of the present month.

The Council felt however he should reconsider his decision. After further prolonged discussion the matter was referred to the Police Commissioner for his recommendations.

AEJOURNMENT.
