COUNCIL SET PRICE Mayor Strang said Mr. Weil Rasmussen nad spoken to ON LOTS I and 2, him about Lots 1 and 2, Tract 899, and had offered the City TRACT 899 at \$200.00 each for the lots, or \$400.00 -Mayor Strang said Mr. Weil Rasmussen had spoken to \$ 500.00.

POST-WAR PLANNING Councilman Carrick presented a sketch he had drawn up regarding proposed plan to increase water supply and storage. FOR NEW WATER SUPPLY & STORAGE Under this plan four phases were outlined as

follows:-

Increase present Water Supply from 700gpm to 1700 gpm,
 Increase present Storage from 500,000 to 1.500,000

2. Increase present Storage from 500,000 to 1.500,000 gallons.

3. Install low cost Treating Pant to eliminate red hard water, and

4. Assure clear, clean, soft water, for a city of

5,000 population.

Councilman Carruck's sketch showed the present 70 ft Gill ranch well - 1,000 gpm - 16" casing, and the proposed 80 ft San Clemente City.well - 1,000 gpm - 16" casing, both situated in the San Mateo Creek Bed.

Our present City wells were: - 500 gpm - 10" casing, and 200 gpm - 8" casing.

A discussion followed in which it was pointed out that the Navy now owns the site on which the proposed new well would be located and that it would be necessary for the City to make a request for water from them; also that a complete plan of the needs of a new water supply and danger to the present supply would have to be drawn up for approval before submission to Navy Department.

City Engineer, William A. Ayer, has already made two reports in connection with the water situation:

- Report on Water Supply of San Mateo Creek Basin, copy of which is to be found on pages 1792-1794 of the Council's Minute Book, No. 4, and presented at Council meeting November 3rd, 1943, and
- 2. Report on the present water supply and possible future Water Supply, copy of which is to be found on pages 1799-1800 of the Council's Minute Book number 4, and presented at Council meeting November 17th, 1944.

It was agreed that Councilman Carrick, James H. Bennett, Superintendent of Public Works, and William A. Ayer, City Engineer, make a survey of the San Mateo Canyon and decide upon the best location for a well and present same to Council at their next regular meeting on March 1st, 1944.
