TEN DEFENSE HOMES ALLOTTED TO SAN CLEMENTE. PLANS DO NOT MEET IN ALL RESPECTS WITH CITY ORDINANCE AND MODIFICAT-IONS IN THIS PARTICULAR CASE

EMERGENCY.

Mayor Strang brought up the question of the ten Defense Homes allotted to San Clemente. He stated that the plans approved by the Government did not meet in every respect with the requirements set up by the City Ordinance, and he was nothin favor of changing our Ordinance.

Edward R. Bartlett, Building Inspector, said he would like to go on record as not being in favor of changing our present Ordinance. However, he would recommend that, if there was any way in which the proposed ten houses could be constructed without too serious a violation, the work should be allowed to go on.

A lengthy discussion took place on the plans before the Council.

SUGGESTED City Attorney B. Z. McKinney gave his opinion that the ACCOUNTEWAR TIME Building Inspector be directed as far as possible to require the buildings to be constructed in conformity to the Building Ordinance of the City, but that in instances due to war time emergency and lack of material, or lack of federal authorization for the material, deviations from the Ordinance were necessary, the Building Inspector be authorized to proceed in accordance with his own best judgement.

The Building Inspector to report to the Council any changes from our present code.

Councilman Smith said he understood a company operating coin machines had been refused a Business License by the Chief of Police and would like tooknow why such license had been refused, also whether or not the Police Chief had the power to refuse anyone a license.

According to City Ordinance the Chief of Police had no right to refuse this application, and the City Attorney, B. Z. McKinney concurred in this, but stated the Chief may have had unstated reasons for not wishing the party to have a license.

Mayor Strang said that as far as he was concerned, it might be well if all the machines were closed down. Councilman Sturgis agreed as well as the rest of the Council.

Our Ordinance called for a sticker to be pasted on each machine, in plain sight, with the number of the machine on it and location of machine, and each machine had had a sticker made out by the Clerk for to be affixed to same, but Councilman Carrick stated that he had checked several machines and could find no stickers.

City Attormey B. Z. McKinney informed the Council that illegal machines under the State Law could not be licenses by the City without incriminating city officials as endorsing said machines.

COIN MACHINES.

LICENSE REFUSED SHOWALTER COY BY CHIEF OF POLICE.

A discussion took place as to what constituted a legal machine and City Attorney McKinney ruled that any machine that paid off in coin was illegal and should be confiscated and impounded by the olice Chief.

The matter was held over for possible action at

a later date.
