RESOLUTION NO. 366.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE STATING THE RESULT OF THE CANVASS OF THE ELECTION RETURNS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD TUESDAY, APRIL 11th, 1944.

WHEREAS, A General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of San Clemente, California, on TUESDAY, the 11th day of April, 1944, as required by law, and,

WHEREAS, it appears that Notice of said Election was duly given in time; form and manner as provided by law, that a voting precinct was duly and legally established, that electics officers were appointed and election supplies furnished, and that in a 11 respects said election was held, conducted, and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed, and the Returns thereof made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the General Laws of the State of California governing elections in Cities of the Sixth Class.

WHEREAS, on this 18th day of April, 1944, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, p.m., being the first Tuesday after said election, said City Council of the City of San Clemente has duly assembled in regular meeting at the regular meeting place of said City Council in the City Hall of said City, to Canvass the "eturns of said Election and to install the newly elected officers, as a result of which the said City Council finds that the number of votes cast, the names of the persons voted for, and other matters required by law to be as hereinafter stated: NOW, THEREFORE,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of San Clemente, as follows, to-wit:-

- 1. That a regular Municipal Election was held and conducted in said City on TUESDAY, the 11th day of April, 1944, in time, form and manner as required by law, and the votes cast thereat were canvassed and the returns thereof made in the time, form and manner as required by law.
- 2. That there was one Consolidated Voting Precinct established for the purpose of holding said election, which voting precinct consisted of a consolidation of the regular election precincts established for holding General State and County Elections as follows: " Eonsolidated Election Precinct "No. 1" comprising State and County Elections in said City.
