BENCHES TO BE PLACED IN PLAZA PARK &C.

Mr. George A. Rettke and Mr. Geoffrey Hamilton, representing the San Clemente Chamber of Commerce, appeared before the Council to ask if it would be permissible to put menches on the Plaza Park for people to occupy. Their idea was to get the business men of the town to denate the benches, and, if allowable, to have their names put on them. There was a great need for them and they would be erected at no cost to the city. city.

Councilman Stoddard said it was a good idea but care should be taken to have the seats of uniform design.

He said there were plenty of rest rooms available for the publics use - the City had one, the Oil Station another, and now the Beach Club was in operation there were enough to meet all requirements. It seemed to him the were enough to meet all requirements. It seemed to him the beach was being kept perfectly clean and sanitary.

Mayor Mulherron said Mr. Holloway was perfectly
right in his claim, he, personally, saw nothing wrong whatever.
