EXPLANATION BY COUNCILMAN STODDARD REGARD-MULHERRON USED BY THE CITY WITHOUT CHARGE.

Councilman Stoddard explained the situation regarding the equipment belonging to Mayor Mulherron being used by the City, viz: the cement mixer, caterpillar tractor, and other types of equipment. Reports had been going round ING EQUIPMENT that city money was being spent on repairs to equipment BELONGING TO MAYOR belonging to Mayor Mulherron. He stated that Mayor Mulherron had granted the use of this equipment to the City without charge and that he had never been paid a cent for its use. There have, however, been occasions where minor repairs have been made to this equipment on account of it being damaged etc by the City on city work and the Council thought it only fair this should be done at the City's expense - there had been some criticism on this It seems to the members of the Council to be a account. very fair proposition. If the City had to rent this equipment from outside sources it would cost them a great deal of money, far more many times over than the City paid for repairs to same. The City is not in a position to buy new equipment. Councilman Stoddard said he made this explanation because he thought Mayor Mulherron was entitled to it and when citizens heard criticisms regarding this matter they could tell them the above are the facts.
