## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE COUNCIL.

City Hall, Dan Clemente, April 21st, 1937.

The Honorable Mayor and City Council, City of San Clemente, California.

Gentlemen.

We, your Committee of the Whole Council, who have had under consideration the matters set forth below, respectfully make the following recommendations:

- 1. That the Agreement cancelling and amending Deed Restrictions on the San Clemente Pier from the Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association of the first part and the City of San Clemente of the second part, and dated April 21st, 1937, be accepted, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and instructed to execute same on behalf of the City. This new Agreement allows the City, with the written approval and consent of the Pank of America National Trust & Savings Association to enter into leases not exceeding ten years for conducting the businesses of rental of fishing boats, selling bait and renting fishing poles, operation of speed boats, renting and selling beach equipment, cafe or restaurant and drug store; also that the City Clerk be instructed to have the Agreement duly recorded.
- 2. That the request of Mr. Adlai Goldschmidt for reduction in his water rate be granted, and that he be put on a flat rate of \$1.00 per thousand cubic feet, effective May 1st, 1937.
- 3. That the Clerk be instructed to write our Assemblymen urging them to actively support and vote for passage of Senate Bill No. 519 embodying Sardine control.
- 4. That an Agreement be entered into between the City and Mr. Leroy M. Strang for the operation of a cafe, selling and rental of beach equipment, &c., on a basis of 5% of the gross receipts or 7½% of the gross receipts if same are over \$2,500.00 per month; and that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary lease and submit same to the Bank of America for approval. The proposed building to be erected by Mr. Strang will be situated at the East end of the Pier and directly opposite to his present stand.
