SUGGESTED PICKETING ORDINANCE. Communication from the Orange County Grand Jury for 1936-7 submitting copy of Ordinance No. 362 being an Ordinance of the County of Orange "Regulating the use of, and prohibiting the obstruction of, Public Highways, Alleys and Sidewalks, prohibiting Besetting and Picketing; prohibiting the use of certain derogatory, indecent and observious language and gestures for certain purposes; and obnoxious language and gestures for certain purposes: and providing penalties for the Violation thereof" which said Ordinance was recommended to the Board of Supervisors of Orange County November 23rd, 1936, by the Orange County Grand Jury 1936-7, and passed by the Board of Supervisors on November 24th, 1936, and said Grand Jury recommend that all Incorporated Cities in the County of Orange adopt this Ordinance in order that all territory in the County of Orange be blanketed by the same regulations: thereby making uniform enforcement possible throughout the County; was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole Council.

Communication from the San Diego Electric Company giving cost of replacing broken glasses in lamps also cost of what extra lights the City may require; was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole Council.
