The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of San Clemente was held in the Council Chamber, Room 210, Easley Building, San Clemente, California, Friday, March 20th, 1936, at 8:00 o'clock, p.m. - Mayor A. T. Smith in the Chair:

NEW BUSINESS.

Councilman Von Bon Horst entered the Council Chamber at this point and took his seat at the Council table.

PURCHASE OF
NEW 8"
SPARLING
METER:

Superintendent of Public Works, L. M. Strang, said about six weeks ago permission was given him by the Council to buy a meter from the Maywood Water Company - Up to date, however, he had heard nothing from them and he asked the Council's permission to purchase a new Sparling Meter costing round about \$180.00, as it was really needed.

After some discussion it was Moved by Councilman Kinney seconded by Councilman Fate, that the Superintendent of Public Works be authorized to purchase a new 8" Sparling Meter.

On roll-call the following was the stated vote, to-wit:

Regarding changing the bowls of the #2 Well, Mayor Smith said we ought to put in new brass bowls and leave the testing of the well until some further date - Councilman Kinney agreed with this suggestion.

After further discussion, it was decided to accept the proposition proposed by the Pomona Pump Company as per their letter dated January 15th, 1936, and postpone the testing of the well until some further date. The difference in the price between cast iron and brass bowls was \$234.00 -

CHANGING
BOWLS OF #2
WELL.

Moved by Councilman Kinney, seconded by Councilman Fate, that we make the change and have brass bowls put in in place of the present ones.

BUSINESS
LICENSES:

Mr. Leo Smith, of the firm of Halstead and Smith, Building Contractors, appeared before the Council and stated that several contractors in the City had been talking about asking the Council to put through a Contractor's License Ordinance. He did not mean for business places but for contractors only. It would be a good thing and would keep out outsiders who would come in for perhaps for one job and take the money out of town. He would like to have the Council's feeling on the matter.

Mayor Smith said the matter had been before the Council several times, and they had always felt that the merchants had been having a tough time to make a living and to put on them added expense was an imposition and the merchants and contractors could not stand it. The City would like to have Licenses imposed but if they licensed one they must license all. He stated the City Attorney had been instructed several months ago to draft a Business License Ordinance, but the question of delinquent taxes came up and he had all he could do without attending to that. The Mayor said he would like to know what the other tradespeople thought about it and would like them all to be in attendance at the next Council meeting and give them their views on the matter.

Mr. Joel Kramer also voiced his view as far as the barbering business was concerned, and volunteered his services to have a full representation of the business people at the next Council meeting to discuss the question.

MEDICAL
INSPECTION OF ALL
PERSONS ENGAGED
IN HANDLING OF
FOODS FOR SALE TO
PUBLIC.

Councilman Von Bon Horst said some time ago the City Council passed an Ordinance requiring all persons who handled foodstuffs in any shape or form to be medically examined periodically for communicable diseases. This was essential from the standpoint of health.

After discussion the Mayor instructed the Police Department to see that the regulations etc governed by this Ordinance were strictly carried out.
(Ordinance No. 56, adopted July 1st, 1932.)

ORDINANCES.

Upon Motion of Councilman Fate, seconded by Councilman Kinney, ORDINANCE NO. 86, BEING AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE PROVIDING THAT THE QUESTION WHETHER THE MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL SHALL RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID CITY; was given its FINAL READING and passed and adopted by the following stated vote, to-wit:

NOES : COUNCILMEN: None,
ABSENT: COUNCILMEN: None.

The Ordinance having received the required number of votes was declared carried.

If the above Ordinance, known as Proposition No. 1 on the Ballot at the General Municipal Election, April 14th, 1936, is carried it will only apply to incoming councilmen and will not affect the present holdover councilmen; also that salaries will not be paid until the commencement of the next fiscal year beginning July 1st, 1936, and then only to those Councilmen who are actually present at the stated meetings of the Council. It does not provide payment to Councilmen for Special meetings but only for stated or adjourned regular meetings of the Council.

ADJOURNMENT.

Moved by Councilman Von Bon Horst, seconded by Councilman Fate, and carried, that the meeting adjourn.
