The City Council will consider whether to place a three-quarters of one

percent (0.75%) special purpose transaction and use (sales) tax on the ballot for the voters to vote on at the general municipal election on November 5, 2024. Under the proposed measure, all funds would be dedicated to resident identified priorities of maintaining local beaches and beach access for residents, keeping sand on local San Clemente beaches, reducing beach erosion, protecting ocean water quality, protecting surfing and ocean swimming locations, and restoring and maintaining the beach trail and the City pier, all of which will help protect San Clemente's local beach economy. The City Council will also consider making changes to the proposed measure.
