#### Staff Recommendation

- 1. Discuss the project generally, the proposed location of the statue and provide specific direction to the City Manager regarding the ongoing maintenance and care of the statue.
- 2. If the City Council wants to proceed with the project, adopt an appropriate resolution. If adopted, Resolution No. 24-139 would:
  - a. Find the project categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Class 3, Section 15303 of the state CEQA Guidelines (14 CCR 15303).
  - b. Conditionally approve the installation of the San Clemente Lifeguard monument in the Parque Del Mar/Pier Bowl area, noted in Exhibit A, subject to the approval of or waiver from the California Coastal Commission and entry into an installation and maintenance agreement with the San Clemente Lifeguard and Junior Lifeguard Foundation.
  - c. Direct staff to proceed with an application to the California Coastal Commission; and
  - d. Direct and authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute an installation and maintenance agreement with the San Clemente Lifeguard and Junior Lifeguard Foundation in a form approved by the City Attorney that provides for the installation and ongoing care and maintenance of the monument to be provided by the San Clemente Lifeguard and Junior Lifeguard Foundation at no cost to the City.
