### A. Fire Prevention Week Proclamation

Mayor Eggleston presented a Proclamation to Battalion Chief Steve Whitaker declaring the week of October 8, 2006 through October 14, 2006 as Fire Prevention Week.

2. MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DAHL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER ANDERSON, CARRIED 5-0, to waive reading in full of all Resolutions and Ordinances.

# Request for Certification of Results of the Shorecliffs Referendum

Andy Price, resident of Shorecliffs and representative of San Clemente Residents for Responsible Government (SCRRG), related his understanding that the temporary restraining order in the matter of <u>Preserve Shorecliffs v. City of San Clemente</u> has not been extended by the courts; requested that the City move forward with the certification of the referendum.

Ryan Wilkinson, San Clemente, stated that he is a proponent of the referendum against Ordinance No. 1319; requested that the results of the referendum petition be certified in accordance with the California Elections Code; stated that the Elections Code requires that the referendum petition be certified by today; asserted that the temporary restraining order has expired and that there is no legitimate reason to delay certification.

Robert Strutt, Shorecliffs, stated that he is a referendum proponent and is named as a real party in interest in the lawsuit against the referendum; urged that the referendum be certified; stated that the temporary restraining order to prevent the certification of the referendum expired on September 29, 2006.

City Attorney Oderman stated that Council and the City Attorney support allowing the City Clerk to announce the final result of the referendum petition and have conveyed this position to the court; explained, however, that the temporary restraining order (TRO), which prohibits the City Clerk from taking any action to certify the petition or determine its legal sufficiency, remains in effect until the hearing on the preliminary injunction; noted that the preliminary injunction hearing was re-scheduled from September 29, 2006 to October 16, 2006.

# San Clemente Amphitheatre

Richard Dickey, Site Selection Chairman for the Association for the Amphitheatre (AFTA), stated that the Association is developing a proposal for Council consideration that will address the need, location, timing, cost, funding source and environmental issues related to an amphitheatre; stated that the Association proposes to retain Hunsaker & Associates to determine the feasibility of utilizing a couple pieces of land for an amphitheatre and to particularly assess any problems that might be related to the initial grant of the Forster Ranch east ridge property to the City.

<u>Pete Deiser</u>, San Clemente, requested that AFTA involve adjacent communities as it pursues a site for an amphitheatre.

# Extension of Avenida La Pata

<u>Pete Deiser</u>, on behalf of Talega Voice, Inc., stated he resides on Calle Aventura, which is below the ridgeline of the planned extension of La Pata; stated that over 1,000 signatures have been gathered in opposition to the eastern alignment of La Pata and stressed that Talega Voice has never advocated a western alignment of La Pata; opined that both alignments are problematic because of their proximity to adjacent communities; urged that Council agendize the possibility of adopting a resolution that declares that neither the eastern nor western alignment of La Pata is acceptable.

<u>Valentin Ignat</u>, representing Talega Voice, Inc., stated that he supports an extension of La Pata, but not 110' from his home on Calle Canela or 400' from homes in Forster Ranch; noted that it is not necessary to construct the La Pata extension 110' from his home when 2,000 feet of open space is available.

# G. <u>Contract Amendment - Segunda Deshecha Canada (MO2) Urban</u> <u>Runoff Treatment Facility, Project No. 14804</u>

Principal Civil Engineer Rebensdorf presented a revised Scope of Work for Amendment No. 3 to Contract C04-69, explaining that the City Attorney requested that Tasks 1 through 3 be described in greater detail.

Principal Civil Engineer Rebensdorf reviewed previous Change Orders to the subject contract, noting that the original contract cost was \$304,124; advised that Change Order No. 1 increased the contract cost by \$34,563, Change Order No. 2 increased the contract cost by \$15,000, and Change Order No. 3 is proposed to increase the contract cost by an additional \$130,336. In response to Councilmember concern, Principal Civil Engineer Rebensdorf explained that the Change Orders were due to a number of factors that were unknown at the time the project commenced.

MOTION BY MAYOR PRO TEM DAHL, SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER RITSCHEL, CARRIED 4-0-1 (COUNCILMEMBER KNOBLOCK ABSTAINING), to approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute, Amendment No. 3 to Contract C04-69, by and between the City of San Clemente and Tetra Tech, Inc., relating to the Segunda Deshecha Canada Urban Runoff Facility, Project No. 14804. Amendment No. 3 increases the contract cost from \$353,687 to \$484,023 (an increase of \$130,336).

# H. Reprogramming of Environmental Protection Agency Grant to Segunda Deshecha Canada (MO2) Urban Runoff Treatment Facility, Project No. 14804

Approve a transfer in the amount of \$300,000 from Account 057-000-33115-000-13808, Clean Ocean Improvement Fund, EPA Grant, Poche (MO1) Dry Weather Runoff Project to Account 057-000-33115-000-14804, Clean Ocean Improvement Fund, EPA Grant, Segunda Deshecha Canada (MO2) Urban Runoff Treatment Facility.

# Possibility of Establishing a Sister City Relationship with Tiberias, Israel

Councilmember Knoblock advised that he is considering bringing to Council the concept of establishing a sister city relationship with Tiberias, Israel; stated that he will present a formal request in the next couple of weeks.

# Riviera Trail (Request for Tray Memo)

Mayor Eggleston requested a tray memo concerning the difficulties being experienced with regard to the construction of the trail at Riviera and comments received from area residents.

#### **Open Space**

Mayor Eggleston voiced concern that not much has been accomplished as a result of the May 23, 2006 Joint Council/Planning Commission meeting with regard to open space; noted that this issue has come to the forefront because of a newspaper article concerning the Pacific Golf Club's development proposal; referenced that the Council and Planning Commission, at the May 23, 2006 Joint Meeting, took action as follows:

- 1) Directed Staff to revise the map to classify existing Open Space areas by Zoning Ordinance categories, and consider the public benefit.
- 2) Directed that the Planning Commission and Staff conduct a study session on how to move forward, and report back to the City Council.
- 3) Identified the need for a process to assign values to existing Open Space.
- 4) Identified the need for a workshop to receive public testimony regarding the residents' preferences concerning the future of the City's Open Space.
- 5) Expressed a desire to prioritize the City's Open Space areas.
- 6) Requested that other communities be queried to determine their Open Space management practices.

Mayor Eggleston acknowledged that some of the tasks are time consuming, but opined that Tasks 2 and 4 should move forward before Council considers the elimination of any open space in the City.

It was agreed that this issue will be agendized for a future Council meeting (possibly for November 6, 2006) so that Council can provide direction relative to prioritization.
